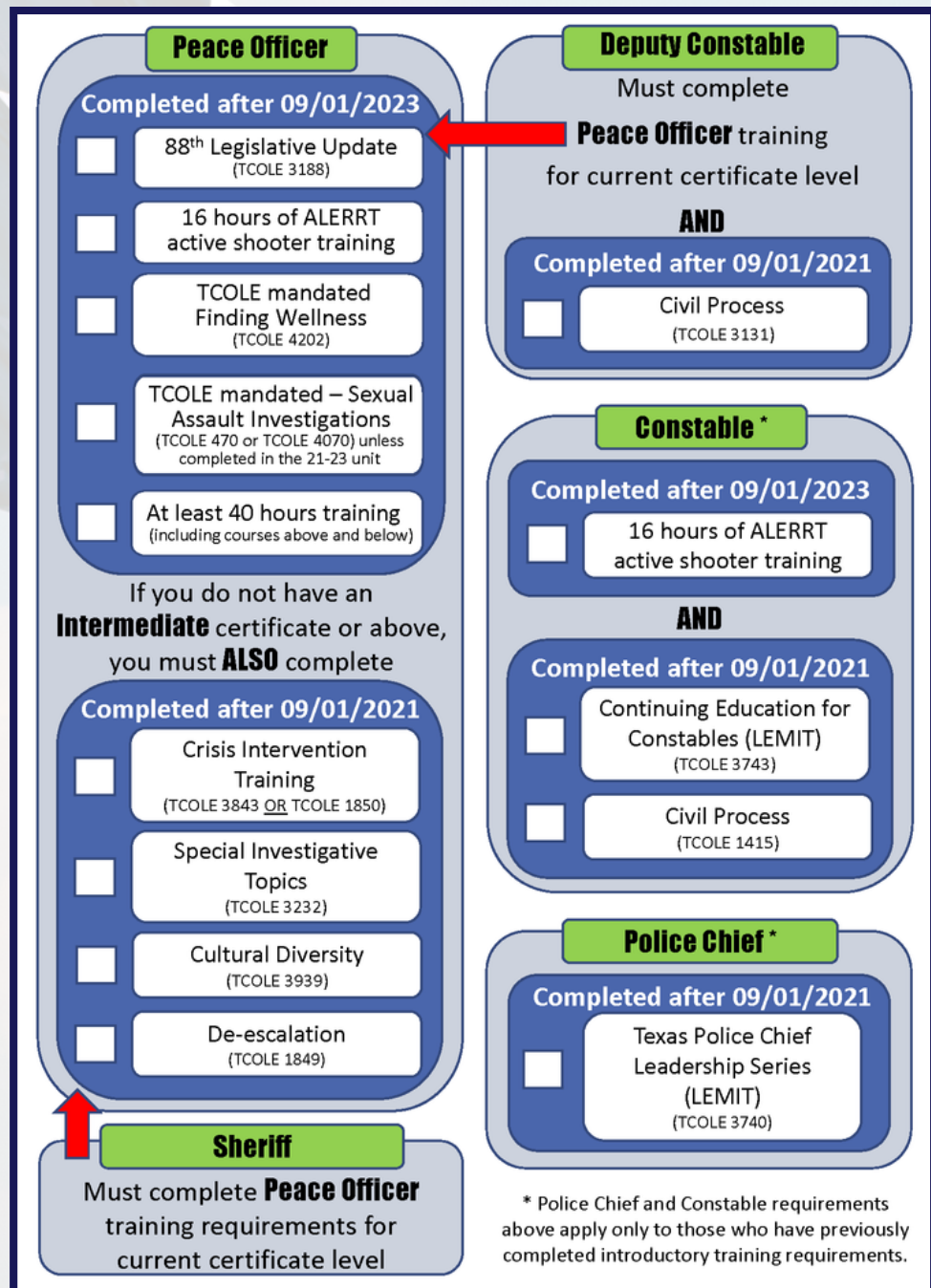

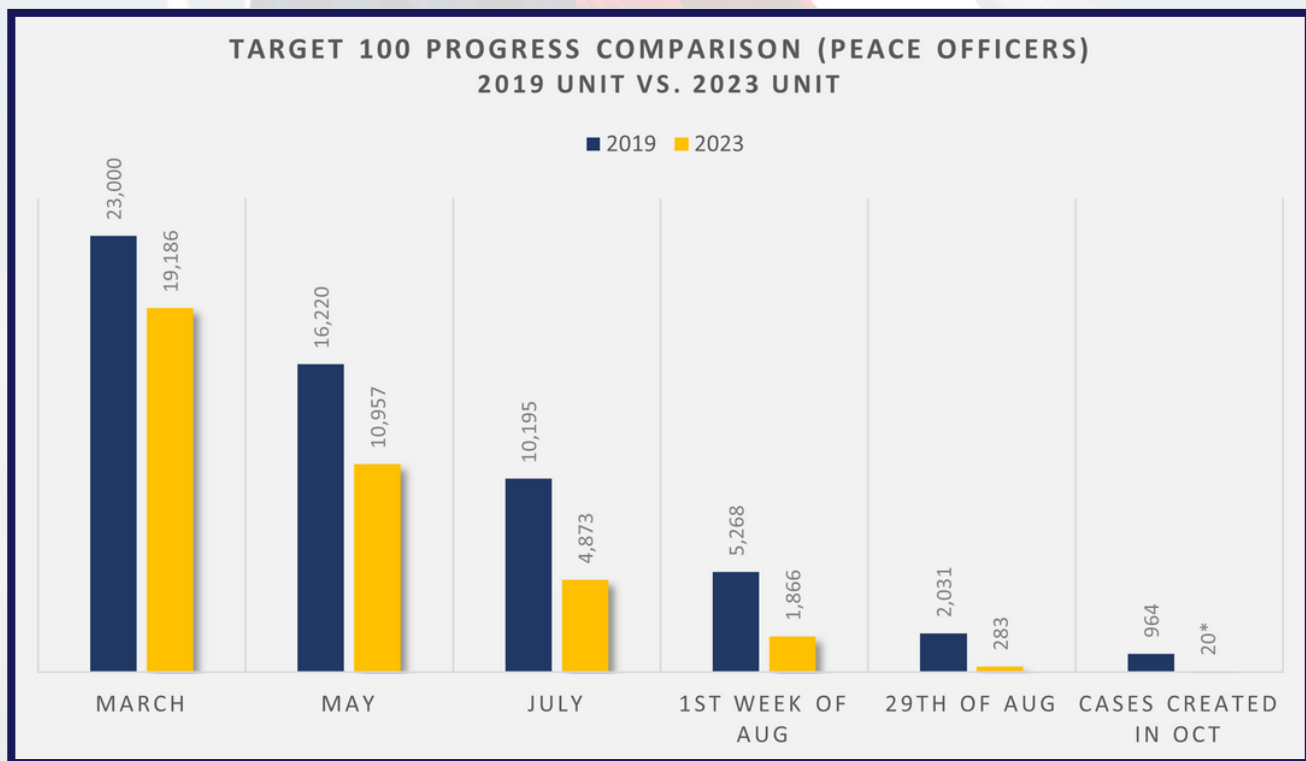

# Target 100 Initiative

In the final weeks of August, TCOLE representatives made direct phone calls to departments and to individuals with outstanding training to ensure that every licensee understood their requirements and each department knew their options. We believe it is because of this proactive communication approach, as well as the addition of self-service features that have made the outcome of this training unit such a phenomenal success.

The chart below shows how this training unit compares to the last 2-year training unit in 2019. We started off at 17% less than the previous unit in March, but ended 98% less cases. Additionally, we've noticed a drop in individuals whose license will be deactivated due to outstanding training by over 1,600 individuals.

To facilitate the success of this initiative, TCOLE released self-service feature within the MyTCOLE account called My Compliance which shows licensees exactly what courses and how many hours they need in order comply with their training requirements by the deadline. TCOLE also sent out several proactive communications to appointed and unappointed individuals.

# TCOLE Advisory Committees

## Law Enforcement Agency Standards

*First Open Meeting: October 9th, 2023*

The Law Enforcement Agency Standards Advisory Committee, as established under Texas Occupations Code §1701.163, is charged with developing “minimum standards with respect to the creation or continued operation of a law enforcement agency based on the function, size, and jurisdiction of the agency.”

The committee will submit a proposed rule to the TCOLE Commissioners for adoption by March 1, 2024.

## Misconduct Investigation and Hiring Procedures, Personnel Files

*First Open Meeting: October 10th, 2023*

The Misconduct Investigation and Hiring Procedures Advisory Committee is charged under Texas Occupations Code 1701.4522 and .4535 with developing model policies “establishing procedures applicable to a law enforcement agency investigating alleged misconduct by a license holder employed by the agency and hiring a license holder” and “regarding personnel files maintained with respect to a license holder.”

The committee will submit the proposed model policies to TCOLE Commissioners for adoption by March 1, 2024. Each law enforcement agency is required to adopt these or substantively similar model policies. All policies are to be submitted to TCOLE, and TCOLE is to retain copies.

## Examination of Licensee

*First Open Meeting: October 11th, 2023*

The Examination of a Licensee Advisory Committee, as established under Texas Occupations Code §1701.167, is charged with developing “a model policy prescribing standards and procedures for the medical and psychological examination” of new licensees, existing licensees, or those whose employing agency has reason to believe that a new examination is necessary (a fit-for-duty review).

The committee will submit a proposed model policy to TCOLE Commissioners for adoption by March 1, 2024. Each law enforcement agency is required to adopt this model policy, or one that is substantially similar. All policies are to be submitted to TCOLE, and TCOLE is to retain a copy.

# New TCOLE Secure Share Feature

We've released a new feature that might help!

We have added a user lookup feature to help find contacts at former law enforcement agencies. You can find User Lookup in the top right corner of the TCOLE Secure Share (TSS) site once you log in.

Enter the department name and click Search. This will return all the active users who have logged in within the last 6 months associated with that department.

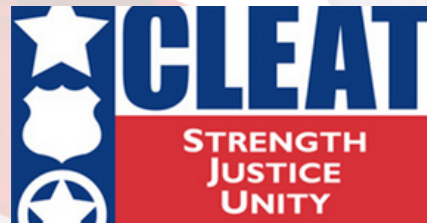

# Education Services



## **New Courses in MyTCOLE**

Education Services has created two brand new courses, “Finding Wellness – Building a Healthier Life” (course #4202) and the “3188: Legislative Update” (course #3188). We have created a FREE online version of “Finding Wellness – Building a Healthier Life” that is now available on MyTCOLE 3.0. The legislative update will be available on MyTCOLE 3.0 later this year. Both instructor resource guides can be found on the TCOLE website. Please note, “Finding Wellness – Building a Healthier Life” has handouts attached to the file that instructors are required to use. The legislative update will not come with an accompanying PowerPoint presentation.

## **Cardiac Emergency Communication**

“Cardiac Emergency Communication” (course #786) is now required for all licensed telecommunicators and must be completed in the 2023-2025 training unit. Education Services created a FREE online version of “Cardiac Emergency Communication” that is currently available on MyTCOLE 3.0. In order to enroll in the online version, students must have a Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certification course reported to TCOLE (course #3845). This includes, but is not limited to, courses from the American Heart Association or American Red Cross.

## **Notice to Trainers**

Please be advised that as of September 1, 2023, in compliance with TCOLE Rule 215.9(3), the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement no longer accepts proprietary letters in lieu of the required course lesson plan.

## **Distance Education/ Remote Delivery Manual**

## ALERT Training Requirements

In the 88th legislative session, Senate Bill 1852 also requires all Texas peace officers to complete 16 hours of training on responding to active shooter training developed by ALERT every two-year training unit beginning with the 2023 -2025 training unit. Not all ALERT courses meet the training mandate. Multiple courses can be taken to achieve the 16 hour training mandate. The following ALERT courses may be taken within the two-year training unit:

# Governor Abbott Expands Life-Saving NARCAN To All Texas Law Enforcement

Governor Greg Abbott has announced a second allotment of 60,000 units of Naloxone (NARCAN) will be distributed to all Texas police departments as part of the statewide “One Pill Kills” campaign. Law enforcement personnel, including municipal police, Independent School District police, and police departments at higher education institutions, will be eligible to receive a portion of this allotment based on county population and size.

As part of the Governor’s plan to expand access to NARCAN, a nasal medication that rapidly reverses opioid poisonings, the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) will begin the next phase of distribution at law enforcement partners' request for their jurisdiction's allotment. In April, as part of the Governor’s “One Pill Kills” initiative and in accordance with a legal settlement between opioid manufacturers and the State of Texas, TDEM began circulating the first 20,000 units of the state’s allotment to each of the 254 county sheriff’s offices in Texas.

TDEM is notifying eligible law enforcement partners across the state of the upcoming distribution, and each may request their jurisdiction’s allotment through TDEM's State of Texas Assistance Request process.

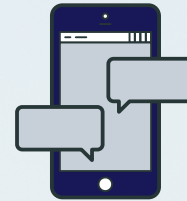
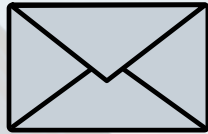
