Suspect arrested in Training Fraud Case

Dudley Parrish was arrested on December 21, 2012 in the State of New Hampshire as a Fugitive from Justice due to a felony warrant issued for Tampering with Government Document in Texas. TCLEOSE has been investigating Parrish over the last year for his part in allegedly reporting state mandated training credit for individuals who did not attend the training. At the time of the offense Parrish was a reserve deputy constable with the Bexar County Precinct 4 Constable's Office. On January 9, 2013, Parrish waived extradition proceedings and is currently awaiting extradition from New Hampshire to Texas.

Background Info:

Texas Peace Officer Licensees are required to attend at least 40 hours of training every two years to maintain an active license.
